

Inspector's Script

Each chapter should have at least two Inspectors. Some have even more.

(The following is to be read when voting is on the agenda)

Good Morning! My name is _____ . I am a Chapter Inspector and also the chapter's _____ (name your category).

As an Inspector, I visit member prospects at their place of business to verify that they are an owner of—or work full time for—a company that falls into the category for which they are applying.
